REFLECTIONS Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-45), German theologian and pastor, was executed by Nazi captors on April 8, 1945, at Flossenburg. It was a foggy morning, there was no ceremony. Bonhoeffer died alone on a prison gallows as a few men and a huge crowd of heavenly witnesses looked on. Malcolm Muggeridge, in A Third Testament quotes a prison

doctor who observed the event: I saw Pastor Bonhoeffer, before taking off his prison garb, kneeling on the floor praying fervently to his God. I was most deeply moved by the way this lovable man prayed, so devout and so certain that God heard his prayer. At the place of execution, he again said a short prayer and then climbed the steps to the gallows, brave and composed. His death ensued after a few seconds. In almost fifty years that I worked as a doctor, I have hardly ever seen a man die so entirely submissive to the will of God!

Dietrich Bonhoeffer's death was not necessary, it could have been prevented. In 1933 he went to a pastorate in England. But as Hitler's influence grew in Germany, Bonhoeffer determined that his Christian duty was back in his homeland. In 1939, Bonhoeffer visited the United States. Friends pressured him to remain in safety in the states, but he insisted on returning, saying "...that he would have no right to participate in the reconstruction of Christian Life in Germany after the war if he did not return to Germany and suffer with other faithful Christians there." (Everett Worthington, Jr., Hope for Troubled Marriages.

Finally, when back in Germany and imprisoned, he could have escaped but refused. His escape, so he thought, might have endangered his brother and uncle who were also prisoners. Muggeridge summarizes Bonhoeffer's life by saying "...he was a man with a strong desire to escape, but who chose deliberately not to, in order to keep his freedom."

Neither prison walls nor even death could steal from his freedom." Such freedom is rooted in commitment. Such commitment stands upon faith. May God give us this kind of faith.

5. We recommend that he/she attend at least one denominational gathering during tenure of office.

6. He/she should take at least one time during tenure of office a study course as offered by the church, on the office of deacon, its responsibilities and obligations.

7. Social and moral standards should be above question. (Acts 6:3; 1 Timothy 3:8-13)

8. Spiritual standards should be in keeping with 1 Timothy 3:9 and Acts 6:3.

9. Should at all times seek to support the work of the ministry in keeping with Acts 6:1-4.

10. Support the financial program of the church by bringing tithes into the treasury of this church.
