The Clinton 12 Commemorate walk took place on Monday—a significant moment to reflect upon the events surrounding the integration of Clinton High School in 1956. As a newcomer to this area, and especially as pastor of this church, I've been spending time thinking about Rev. Paul Turner.

Many of you know what happened to him; I've read the manuscript of his sermon the Sunday after he was beaten. During an incredibly divisive and volatile period for this community, Turner desired to "lead our church do the right thing."

It's been 60 years since that time, but the admonition to do the right thing is just as needed today as it was then.

These last few weeks, I've been preaching on our witness to the community. And, in particular, making space for people regardless of where they are in their spiritual journey. First Baptist has a unique pedigree and presence in this community, one that I want to build on and celebrate.

You all have been gracious in your hospitality to Lori, Lucy, Matt, and me these last few weeks. I'm most grateful as we

continue settling in to a new town and new people.

This also means I'm getting acquainted with church staff, lay leaders, financial matters, and some of the history related to why and how this church functions. This remains a work in progress, and one area in particular I wanted to mention relates to our **children's ministry**.

I've spoken to Betty Kay and expressed gratitude for her leadership in this vital area of our church's life. She's planned, promoted, and carried out wonderful events like VBS and other summer activities. The children's back to school kickoff was terrific (horses included!); we've also talked about upcoming events like "Trunk or Treat" and even what next summer's VBS might look like. She also keeps Sundays and Wednesdays moving in a positive direction.

I realize there has been a children's minister search committee in place. Recently, I spoke with Beth Green, chair of this committee about what has been and where we are now in this ministry area. In short, I've asked Betty Kay to continue leading our children's ministry. I value her dedication, love for our children and parents, along with her willingness and desire to continue in this capacity. She's added stability and consistency at a time when it's been most needed.

I know you'll join me in expressing gratitude not only to her, but all our staff who serve faithfully and well. I'm looking forward to a wonderful Fall and Advent season over the next few months. Keep praying for me as I desire to "lead our church to do the right thing" to exemplify Jesus Christ in all that we do.
