FIRST THOUGHTS

WOW! That's not necessarily a theological word, but an apt description of our worship services these last several weeks. They have been well-planned, meaningful, and well attended. Special thanks to our musicians, praise team, and adult choir for their contributions.

It's a wonderful privilege to gather for worship each week, yet sometimes this practice is taken for granted. Those first Christians suffered and died for the right to worship Jesus Christ and live out their faith in their community. We've been learning a little bit about this through the sermon series on the Seven Churches of Revelation. It's a challenge to discern and appreciate what these early Christians experienced in the first century, and then apply that to our $21^{\rm st}$ century context.

Historically, Baptists have been on the forefront of religious freedom. They were persecuted centuries ago in this country as they sought to worship freely without government intervention. We are the beneficiaries of early Baptist leaders like Roger Williams, John Leland, Obadiah Holmes, and Isaac Backus. Their leadership and courage led to the establishment of historic Baptist distinctives which we now know as "a free church in a free state" and "the separation of church and state." Our nation as a whole still benefits from their legacy and influence.

Those seven churches didn't have the freedoms you and I enjoy. Affirming that earliest Christian creed "Jesus Christ is Lord" could mean death at the stake, arena, or on a cross. It was costly to be a follower of Jesus Christ. The ancient quote still remains true today: "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church." Let's never take our freedom of worship for granted.

On a related note, it's time for submissions to our **Advent Devotional Guide.** As of this writing, it's (only) 93 days until Christmas! The theme for this year's work **is "Make My Life a Bethlehem"** which is also the title of the Adult Choir's Christmas program.

This compilation of devotions is a wonderful gift not only to our church family but it can also be shared with others in our community. The Advent Guide is a meaningful worship resource, and sharing your story will enhance the Advent season for us all. 
