FIRST THOUGHTS

A few days ago, John MacArthur celebrated his 50th anniversary at Grace Community Church. The California pastor has written a number of books, and he's been outspoken on a variety of topics.

At a conference celebrating his half century of ministry, MacArthur and several panelists were on stage fielding a variety of questions. Then the moderator asked them to offer their gut reactions to one- or two-word phrases. When the moderator said "Beth Moore." MacArthur replied. "Go home."

The reaction to this pithy response has caused quite an uproar in the evangelical community; it was even a trending topic on Twitter for a short period of time. His response intrigued but didn't surprise me, as I'm familiar with his theological perspective and leanings. While I've used a few of MacArthur's resources in the past, I don't find agreement with him on this issue.

What I did find instructive was Moore's response to the Twitterstorm and his critique of her ministry: "I did not surrender to a calling of man when I was 18 years old. I surrendered to a calling of God. It never occurs to me for a second to not fulfill it. I will follow Jesus—and Jesus alone—all the way home. . . "

Over the course of my life as a Baptist pastor, I've discovered a wide diversity of opinions and personalities as it relates to life in the church. We are all influenced by our life experiences and come to Scripture with our own biases and limitations. What I have tried to model and emphasize, however, is that our shared core belief is the earliest Christian creed: "Jesus Christ is Lord".

Through my own biblical and theological pilgrimage, I have come to believe service in the Kingdom of God is based on gifts and calling rather than gender. On a more personal level, as a father of two daughters, it is important for them (and my son!) to see this lived out in the local congregation.

It is very important to me to be part of a Baptist church who nurtures this spirit of service and calling. I'm especially thankful for those of you who teach, support, and encourage my children in their spiritual formation. I thank you all for your concern for them, and all the young men and women who are part of our family of faith.

Women were the first to arrive at the empty tomb of Jesus. And, it was Mary Magdalene who was the first herald of the resurrection. I'm so grateful that she didn't simply "go home" after she experienced the risen Lord. Her example is formative to our faith and instructive to our witness for Christ.

We're entering the season of Thanksgiving (!) My family and I will be celebrating the holiday season with you and in east Tennessee for the first time. Please know how grateful we are for your continued prayers, sweet spirit, and encouragement.

Homeless-a-thon Together we make a difference for those in need.

Who is homeless in Anderson County?

Children, youth, elderly, disabled, single women (& pregnant women), single men, families, veterans, & people working full-time jobs. Homeless women outnumber homeless men (2018: 141 men & 199 women).

What causes them to be homeless?

Lack of resources & lack of a support system. Many people live paycheck-to-paycheck with inadequate safety nets & get behind on bills when they (or someone in the family) experience job loss, medical bills, loss of transportation, residential fire, death in the family, or injury, illness, or disability (physical or mental) that makes them unable to work for a period of time. Many of us have family & friends to turn to in difficult times, but some do not.

WHAT: A homeless-a-thon is an event where participants get sponsorships, usually hourly, to sleep outside in makeshift shelters (similar to the well-known nationwide program "Sleep Out").

WHY: The goals of this event are to raise awareness & education in our community, empathy & compassion among participants, and funds for the cause of homelessness in Anderson County.

WHEN: Friday night, Nov. 15th, 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.

WHERE: The host site is the parking lot of First Baptist Church of Clinton (also the financial sponsor of the event).

WHO: church youth groups, sports teams, clubs or civic groups, and non-profit agencies can all register teams for the event.
