Pandemic Possibilities:

Pandemics often keep us focused on what we *can't* do, but they also bring great opportunities to love our neighbors in need! There are ways you can safely help your community! Make your holiday season most meaningful by considering some of the following:

1. Gift bags for those vulnerable & in need (our shut-in list, those shut-in because of quarantining, & our friends at the Towers): We need lots of help!!! Go to www.fbclinton.org/care-packages to craft a personal touch for our shut-ins: color bookmarks, decorate cards, create origami or a meaningful crochet chain from instructional videos! Drop off travel size lotion, travel sized Kleenex packets, and 12 pack colored pencils (\$1.00) in the Garden Room! Crafts & donations due Dec. 6th. Help also needed assembling bags, socially distanced!

2. Christmas Caroling & Gift Bag delivery: Thursday evening Dec. 17th. We have a greater number of shut-ins this year due to the pandemic. WE NEED HELP! Singing will be spaced out with masks on lawns. Gifts will be dropped off on the porch. If you can help, contact the church office.

3. Our community is anticipating greater need for our Angel Tree Ministry. Consider "being Christmas" for a child on our Angel Tree, located in the Garden Room, beginning Nov. 8! Monetary donations are also accepted! Shoppers & Gift Wrappers also needed!

4. Thanksgiving & Christmas Food Box Giveaways: We are raising funds for ~450 food boxes! We also need volunteers to assemble hospitality snack bags and donate cracker packs, granola bars, & Little Debbie treats (drop these off in the Garden Room & Earmark your monetary donations "Turkey Time").

5. Our **Clothing Ministry** needs volunteers to sort, organize, fold, and hang up clothing! We are also searching for a new Clothing Ministry Coordinator.

6. Our community is raising funds for an AC Isaiah House, temporary housing for Foster Children, by doing lemonade stands, t-shirt sales, and several other things! Contact Amanda for more info.

7. **Veteran's Day** is Nov. 11th! Consider donating to our American Legion Post to help veterans with rent, utilities, & various needs or making "Thanks for your service" cards to pass out at their meetings (15-30 in attendance), or for the Veteran's Nursing Home (~125 beds). 8. The pandemic has created greater needs for the **homeless**—we're struggling to keep all our children, sick, and disabled living indoors. Consider donating funds, tents & sleeping bags, or Food City or Kroger gas gift cards (\$10 each) to help those living in their cars idle longer for warmth. Donations to AC TORCH.

9. Residents & staffs of nursing homes are under guarantine strain with residents separated from their loved ones and support systems. Consider these ways of supporting The Waters of Clinton: making cards, donating in-kind supplies, filling birdfeeders, decorating the outsides of residents' windows, etc. Contact Amanda for more info.

10. November is National Caregivers Month! It takes a special kind of person to be a caregiver! Caregiving is one of the hardest jobs there is, yet these folks are sooooo special, needed, and underappreciated. Caregiving for family members with special needs is especially straining during times of guarantine, when schedules are off, proximities are close, and stress is high. A support group is needed in our area. Take time to love the caregivers around you: Thank a caregiver! Pamper a caregiver! Give a caregiver an hour break!

11. Frontline Workers! Nursing home and hospital staff are under added strain! Consider supporting the doctors, nurses, and staff at Methodist Hospital in Oak Ridge by contacting Vo. Coord. Kim Mays (865-835-4170).

12. Quarantining is making area refugees feel even more estranged during this pandemic. Consider supporting Knoxville Internationals Network (with needs even in AC) by 1) being a face-to-face English language and mentoring partner 2) Have your small group adopt a refugee family for a period of one year (contacting them at least once a month)—help them assimilate, socialize, and navigate the ins & outs of daily life in America—basic support and encouragement. 3) decorate &/or deliver Christmas wreaths that KIN supplies. 4) Consider starting an ESL Class at our church!

Important information about this year's Turkey Time:


- We will not be collecting food items. •
