He writes, "Every day, I get a call from someone who wants to know when we'll get back to normal. The honest answer is we don't know. The real answer is 'never.'"

I think he's right. I don't see us ever returning to a pre-COVID posture, and it will be up to us as to whether that will be a good thing or not. It's possible that we can learn some valuable lessons about the importance of our life together.

On a related note, I wanted to let you know of my plan to take a month sabbatical in July 2022. This is part of the Pastoral Call Agreement that I signed with this church; I'll provide additional details in the months ahead.

Finally, I'm excited to welcome Vicki Violette to our church staff as Minister of Education and Lauren Neal as our Interim Minister of Children. Let's be sure to pray for them as they transition into their leadership roles.

Thank you for your faithfulness in your prayers, giving, and participation in the life of our church. We are still the church whether we are "gathered" or "scattered" so let's live our lives in faith knowing "our labor for the Lord is not in vain" (I Cor. 15.58).


