First Thoughts

It's happening more frequently. After worship on Sunday mornings, I'll have people talk to me as if they've known me for a while, even though they've never been in the same room with me. It's a phenomenon of having people who have attended our worship services online (often for months) and then decide to attend worship in-person for the first time.

It's an interesting dynamic; those who have been previously joined us online are now are opting to be in the room with us. The inperson AND online experience is being called a 'hybrid' approach to worship and ministry.

While important, this hybrid approach does create additional work for our AV team. Having two worship services on Sunday equates to four worship services for them (2 in person, 2 online). Specific preparations are required for each of them—so I'm especially grateful for their efforts and abilities to do these effectively and well.

Some churches have attempted to wean their people off the online service, thinking this will force (strongly encourage?) their people to come to the building. What they are finding is that people get accustomed to choice and will simply 'tune in' to another church's worship service. A hybrid approach to worship is here to stay, a 21st century reality enhanced by the arrival of the COVID19 pandemic.

Most of you are aware that Rev. William Caldwell's funeral service was in our Sanctuary a few weeks ago. The room was filled to capacity and the event was live-streamed on our Facebook and YouTube platforms. Since that moment, we have had more than 2000 views of the funeral service. At least 2000 persons used computers, phones, and other electronic devices to access a window into the life and worship of our church. And, a number of these persons who found us are now following us and want to be notified when we go "live" for our worship services.

There's <u>no substitute</u> for being in the room for worship and fellowship. But, the reality is that an online worship service is now the 'front door' for getting people into the church. So, here are two final thoughts on the subject:

First, when you see someone on Sunday for the first time (and we're having more 1st time guests), it's possible that s/he may have seen us online and that's why they've chosen to be in our building.

Second, this ministry (and others like it) is made possible by your generous support of our operating budget. Let's keep up our giving through the Lord's tithe and our offerings—especially as we enter the summer months. Your faithful financial support enables all of us to be part of something that's making an eternal difference.

Our Response to SBC Sexual Abuse Report

The allegations of the mishandling of sexual abuse incidents, as recently reported by Guidepost Solutions, an investigative firm, detailing failures of leadership in the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) in addressing complaints of sex abuse by pastors and staff, are both shocking and saddening. We pray for positive and real changes to occur throughout the SBC and for the leadership to implement and enforce policies and procedures to identify and prevent all forms of sexual misconduct. We want to assure you, here at FBC, we are proactive and are continuing the process of working with committees and staff members to create procedures and policies that will identify and avert any type of sexual misconduct from occurring in our Church. The policy of First Baptist Church of Clinton is that inappropriate sexual behavior is a violation of the principles set forth in scripture and is never permissible nor will it be tolerated. Furthermore, it is the policy of this Church that any allegation of sexual misconduct will be treated with the seriousness it deserves and dealt with swiftly and fairly for the benefit of all parties concerned.

May we be in prayer for all victims of sexual abuse no matter where they occur.




