Civil discourse or discussing other topics had proven to be almost impossible, and now having them under his roof would be emotionally draining and a miserable experience.

Thanksgiving is supposed to be about gratitude and counting our blessings. I'm hoping your Thanksgiving is much more pleasant than the one my friend anticipated. Each one of us has within us the capacity to set a positive and grateful tone.

I'm looking forward to being with you all for another holiday season and am thankful that we can share life together. Let's make our wants few and be grateful for what the Lord has given us.
