First Thoughts...

In 1968, the country was close to having a nervous breakdown. The Vietnam War was going on, culture wars were raging and racial tensions were at a boiling point. In April, Martin Luther King was assassinated in Memphis. A few months later, in June, Robert Kennedy was assassinated as he campaigned for the presidency.

US News and World Report described it this way: "As the year ended, it was not all clear how or whether the nation would settle down. Many wondered if the country was becoming ungovernable as everyday Americans began to lose optimism about the future. A travel ad in France summed up the mood of the country felt by many: 'See America While it Lasts.""

The history and mood of our nation is instructive for where we are today.

Charlie Kirk's assassination has rocked and shocked our nation. Emotions are running high right now, and I hope we can all pray for his wife and two small children. No one should have their spouse, parent, or child taken away from them like this. I hope we can also agree that political violence and retaliatory violence have no place in this country.

Kirk had a large online following and his Turning Point USA chapters exist on many college campuses. He'd visit these campuses and sit under a tent with the words "Prove Me Wrong" on top of it. Students, faculty, and others were allowed to come to a microphone and debate, disagree, challenge, or question his views. What I hope we can take away from this example is how precious our 1st Amendment right to the freedom of speech is in this nation.

Dr. Jon Mecham, Professor of Political Science at Vanderbilt University and Presidential Historian said this: "When we lose our capacity for argument, dissent, and debate—peaceably—we are breaking faith with the American covenant. And the American covenant is that we live in contention with each other, but we're not at each other's throat."

In Luke 9, Jesus sends James and John into Samaria, but the people would not welcome Jesus, because he was heading towards Jerusalem. This reaction frustrated James and John so they asked Jesus, "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?" Jesus rebuked them, and he and his disciples went to another village.

Gov. Spencer Cox of Utah said this: "We can return violence with violence. We can return hate with hate, and that's the problem w/ political violence—is it metastasizes, because we can always point the finger at the other side. And at some point, we have to find an off ramp, or it's going to get much, more worse. History will dictate if this is a turning point for our country, but every single one of us gets to choose right now if this is a turning point for us."

People are looking and listening to the church right now. Let's make sure we're looking and listening to Jesus, and living for Him as well. Stay encouraged and remember that you are loved.



The **Trustees** recommendation for the church to pay TK Elevator, Cooks Mechanical, Central Technology, and HSC a total of \$2,296.50 for repairs due to a power surge the church experienced on August 23, 2025 was approved and will be paid from Trustees Capital Expenditures. The **Finance** Committee's recommendation to change the amount requiring prior approval from Finance Committee and Church for purchases of items/services be changed from \$500 to \$1,000 was approved. The **Deacons** recommended that Pastor Danny represent our church as a messenger at TBMB annual meeting on Nov. 9-11, was approved. The Church Clerk's recommendation to transfer the letter of Jancie Bailey to Grace Baptist Church, was approved.
